- It has the ability to take long or short exposure across four asset classes (Global Equities, Global Fixed Income, Commodities, Currencies) and in up to 55 different futures markets.

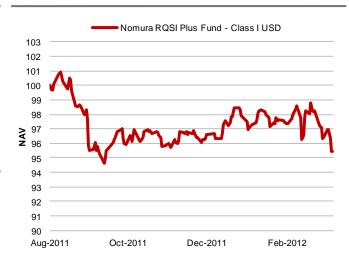

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Market Commentary²

The RQSI Plus Fund was negative in March. Continued signs of a fragile economic expansion, along with strong corporate earnings and a reduction in fear over the European debt morass, drove equity prices higher and weakened safe haven assets such as gold and U.S. Treasuries. The overall portfolio maintained a "risk-on" bias for much of March, highlighted by long equity exposure.

Equity markets continued to move higher, punctuating the best calendar quarter for U.S. stocks since 1998. The S&P 500 gained over 3% in March, outperforming the MSCI World Index, which rose a little more than 1%. European indices were generally weaker, with the exception of the German DAX, which rose 1.5%. Asian markets also slumped, except for the Nikkei, which bounced almost 5%.

Bond markets felt the sting of the largest back-up in yields since 3Q11. The benchmark 10-year U.S. Treasury fell over 1% in price, and the 30-year long Bond dropped almost 3%. The JP Morgan Global Bond Index fell only fractionally. Currency markets exhibited the most dispersion we have seen in some time, breaking with the monolithic "risk-on/risk-off" pattern that has typified the past few years. The U.S. Dollar Index rose less than half a per cent, but non-dollar crosses exhibited large swings. Commodity currencies such as Australian and Canadian dollars weakened, as did the Japanese yen. However the Euro currency was flat and British pound rose fractionally against the USD.

Commodity markets weakened and the Reuters/CRB Commodity Index shed over 4%. Industrials metals, especially aluminium, were weaker on continued evidence of slowing Chinese demand. Precious metals also fell as risk aversion and inflationary pressures subsided. The energy complex was mostly lower, though Brent crude (up close to 1%) continued to outperformed WTI (-4%). Natural gas continues its epic bear market, plunging nearly 25% during the month. Grains were also mixed, with the soybean complex vastly outperforming corn and wheat on growing supply fears regarding the South American bean crop.
