## **Fund description**

Investment objective:

The fund seeks to achieve positive absolute returns, irrespective of the present market environment and at considerably lower volatility than equity markets. The fund invests (long and short) in liquid equities and equity-related securities of European companies. For the purpose of maintaining liquidity, the fund also holds a portfolio of short-term fixed-income investments. The fund is suitable for investors with a long-term horizon and medium to high risk tolerance who want to diversify their portfolio with an absolute-return strategy offering a low correlation with other asset classes.

Opportunities:

Risk factors:

The fund invests in a broadly diversified equity universe and seeks opportunities for returns wherever they exist. A highly qualified and experienced management actively manages the fund on the basis of a fundamental valuation approach. The objective is to identify the potential investments that, in the Investment manager's opinion, are most attractive and to generate interesting and profitable opportunities for investors. The fund primarily pursues a market- and sector-neutral long/short strategy, giving it the opportunity to profit from both rising and falling prices. The expected volatility is likely to be significantly lower than in traditional equity funds.

Counterparty Risk / Derivatives: If a counterparty to a financial derivative contract were to default, the value of the contract, the cost to replace it and any cash or securifies held by the counterparty to facilitate it, may be lost.





## Glossary

Alpha (Jensen's): Jensen's Alpha measures the performance of an investment (fund) in relation to its benchmark. A positive alpha means that the value of the fund has generated a higher return than the benchmark.

Benchmark: an index that can be used by an investment fund as the basis of comparison for assessing the performance achieved.

Beta: a measure of the volatility of the performance of an investment relative to the performance of the underlying market. An investment with a beta of 1 indicates that its performance will move up or down in line with the performance of the market. An investment with a beta of more than 1 means that its performance rises and falls more than that of the market; beta of less than 1 means that its performance rises and falls less than that of the market.

Correlation: a statistic measurement which shows the linear relationship (or degree of parallel movement) between two series of figures, for example the performance of two equity investments.

High water mark: the high water mark principle establishes a cap on or allows for a potential rise in performance fees. According to this principle, the investment fund manager only receives the relevant

remuneration when the fund exceeds the highest level of return that it has ever achieved.

Information ratio: the information ratio expresses the ratio of additional returns generated to the extra risk involved. The value generated can be used to evaluate active management.

Ongoing charge: the ongoing charge is a measure of the annual expenses incurred by a fund and is expressed as a percentage. It allows an accurate comparison of the costs of funds from different companies to be made.

Risk rating: the risk indicator is based on the volatility of the Fund's performance over the last 5 years. Where 5 years' performance history is not available the data is supplemented by proxy fund, benchmark data or a simulated historical series as appropriate. This profile is determined using historical data, as such may not be a reliable indication for the future risk profile. It is not guaranteed and may

Sharpe ratio: the Sharpe ratio (risk-adjusted performance) is generated by calculating the difference between the average annualised return and the risk-free return. The resulting figure is divided by the annualised standard deviation of the returns. The higher the Sharpe ratio, the better the fund performance in relation to the risk potential of its portfolio.

Tracking error: the tracking error measures the divergence between the return of a fund in relation to its benchmark.

Volatility: a risk indicator demonstrating the fluctuation range (for example of the price or return of a security or fund unit) over a defined period; volatility is most often calculated using standard deviation. The

higher the volatility, the greater the fluctuation range.
