
Objective

The Fund aims to provide a combination of income and growth by investing in bonds (which are like loans that can pay a fixed or variable interest rate) issued or guaranteed by governments, supranational institutions or government-related bodies in Emerging Market countries. The Fund aims to outperform the JP Morgan EMBI Global Diversified Index (USD) benchmark (before charges).

Portfolio securities

- The Fund invests at least 70% of its assets in US Dollar denominated debt and debt-related securities, which are issued by governments, supranational institutions or government-related bodies located in Emerging Market countries.
- -Non-US Dollar denominated issues will typically be hedged back to US Dollars.
- The Fund may also invest in other transferable securities, money-market instruments, deposits, cash and near cash, derivatives (including currency forwards, interest rate and credit default swaps) and collective investment schemes.
