#### Objectives and investment policy

The Neuberger Berman China Equity Fund ("Fund") aims to increase the value of your shares through a combination of growth and income by investing in the shares of companies that carry out a majority of their activities in the greater China region: China, Hong Kong, Macau or Taiwan. The Fund will identify opportunities by carrying out intensive research on companies as well as the general economic outlook for the region. The Fund will mainly invest in:

- Equities (shares) and equity-linked securities in mid and large-sized companies. Equity-linked securities are instruments that derive their value from equities using only a fraction of the money that would be needed to buy shares directly. This may result in the Fund being leveraged.
- Debt instruments (obligation that enables the issuing party to raise funds by promising to repay a lender in accordance with terms of a contract) with warrants attached. Warrants are a derivative security that entitle the holder to buy a set amount of a security at a set price within a certain time frame.
- The Fund may also invest in financial derivative

instruments that exaggerate the potential returns or potential losses to achieve more growth, reduce risk or increase operational efficiencies.

The Fund does not track a benchmark. However, its performance may be compared against the MSCI China Index (US dollar Total Return Gross), an index that measures companies listed in China.

You may sell your shares on any day when the financial markets in London, China and Hong Kong are open for business.

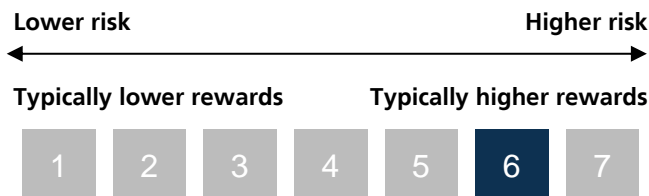
This Fund may not be appropriate for short-term investment.

As your shares are in euro and the Fund is in US dollars, currency exchange contracts are used to reduce the effect of changes in the currency exchange rate.

Your shares do not pay you income, but returns are reinvested to grow capital.

Transaction costs will reduce the Fund's return.

#### Risk and reward profile



This Fund is in category 6 due to its level of historical volatility. As the share class has less than 5 years of returns history, the historical volatility includes benchmark/representative portfolio returns. The Fund invests in a variety of investments, some of which can vary significantly in price from day to day due to a number of factors.

The main risks facing the Fund are:

- Market Risk:** The risk of a change in the value of a position as a result of underlying market factors, including among other things, the overall performance of companies and the market perception of the global economy. In addition, as the Fund invests in businesses that are connected with less advanced countries and economies, certain risks exist. The market for investments in such countries may be less developed making it difficult for the Fund to sell its investments in such markets and political and social instability may lead to a reduction in the value of the investments in such countries. Accounting and auditing standards and availability of financial information may vary across the markets in which the Fund invests.
- Liquidity Risk:** The risk that the Fund may be unable to sell an investment readily at its fair market value. The Fund is permitted to use equity-linked securities that in some cases may multiply gains and losses, thus significantly increasing risk. The Fund aims to limit potential losses by using an advanced regular risk management assessment. The use of equity-linked securities involves other risks, in particular counterparty credit risk (see Counterparty Risk section for further details). The Shanghai and Shenzhen Stock Exchanges are not as active as exchanges in more developed markets which may affect the ability to sell your shares.
- Counterparty Risk:** The risk that a counterparty will not fulfil its payment obligation for a trade, contract or other transaction, on the due date. The insolvency of any institution providing services such as the safekeeping of assets or acting as counterparty in respect of derivatives or other instruments may expose the Fund to financial loss.

- Derivatives Risk:** The Fund is permitted to use certain types of derivatives instruments to obtain or increase exposure to its underlying assets, for other investment purposes, or to seek to protect its assets against some of the risks outlined in this section. Their use will create leverage, an investment technique which gives an investor a larger exposure to an asset than the amount it invested. The Fund's use of leverage may result in greater variations (both positive and negative) in the value of your shares. However, leverage is limited to 100% of the Fund's assets and the investment Manager will ensure that the Fund's use of derivatives does not materially alter the overall risk profile of the Fund. Please refer to the prospectus for a full list of the types of derivative that the Fund may utilize. The use of equity-linked securities involves other risks, in particular counterparty credit risk (see Counterparty Risk section for further details).
- Operational Risk:** The risk of direct or indirect loss resulting from inadequate or failed processes, people and systems including those relating to the safekeeping of assets or from external events.
- Currency Risk:** A risk to investors who subscribe in a currency other than the base currency of the Fund. Fluctuations in these exchange rates may affect the return on investment. The Fund uses derivative instruments to reduce this risk. The Fund may also hold investments in currencies other than the base currency and the share class is fully exposed to this risk.

A category 1 fund is not a risk free investment - the risk of losing money is smaller than that of a category 7 fund, but the likelihood of making gains is also lower. The seven-category scale is complex: for example, a category 2 fund is not twice as risky as a category 1 fund.

The category is calculated based on historical data which may not be a reliable indicator of future risk. The risk category shown is not static and may change over time.

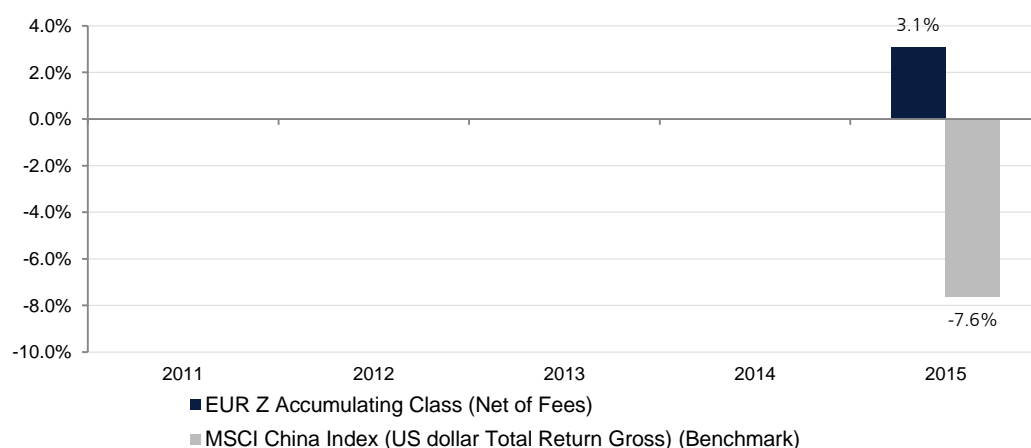
These charges reduce the growth of your investment.
