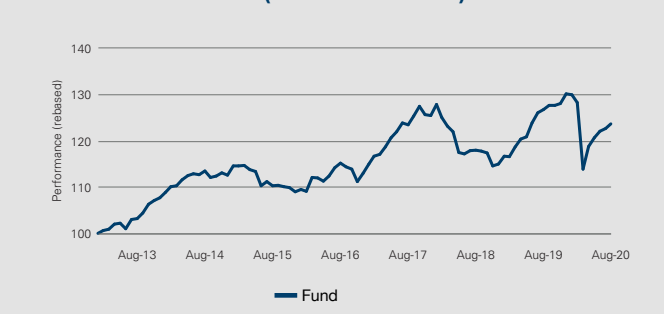

## COMMENTARY

The Fund returned 0.81% in August and -5.0% year to date.

Risk appetite remained robust in August, as credit spreads moved tighter. Government bond yields moved higher however, led by US treasuries, and the US dollar lower as the Federal Reserve confirmed a move to a new inflation targeting system. The macroeconomic picture and virus statistics also improved for many key global economies. Global investment grade bonds fell in August, due entirely to higher government bond yields, while global high yield bonds returned positively. In this light the Fund's investment grade holdings outperformed, contributing positively towards returns while the Fund's high yield holdings also contributed towards performance.

The AA Group bonds were the largest contributor to fund performance in August, with private equity funds in the US said to have made bids for the firm, which must now be finalised by the 29th of September. ETP reported results on the 5th of August, and after having a relatively weak July, regained ground and contributed positively towards fund performance.

Tactical positioning in August detracted from performance, driven mostly by FX positioning as the US dollar continued to weaken. The Fund utilised tactical hedging to reduce the overall risk levels of the Fund, which continues to carry a higher exposure to undervalued credit.

In August, core and non-core government bonds performed modestly. Government bond holdings were maintained at around 16% of the Fund throughout the month.

Cash government bond positions in European peripherals Italy, Spain and Portugal were maintained throughout the month capitalising on support from the European Recovery Fund and a healthy yield enhancement compared to the fund's negative duration future positions in German bunds and French OATs. Longer-dated US treasury positions in 20-year and 30-year bonds were also held.

The Fund maintained a near 20% short Sterling position against the US Dollar throughout August, which detracted from performance as positive risk sentiment continued elsewhere and the Fed transitioned to a longer-term dovish stance following its monetary policy framework review.

The Fund also held a small CDX HY position at the start of August, which was added to taking the position to 10%, along with a 5% iTraxx Crossover hedge in the final week of the month. CDS Index hedging detracted in August.

Central bank stimulus remains a key driver of markets, as emphasized by the Federal Reserve's latest longer-term policy shift on inflation targeting. The recovery in economic data has also been maintained with the US, Germany and the UK all posting robust August composite PMI data above 50, in expansionary territory. Market valuations, particularly in equity markets, are now looking somewhat more stretched, however. Importantly, threats to a V-shaped recovery remain in the form of the potential for virus second-wave lockdown restrictions in the absence of a vaccine. The immediate road ahead could start to become somewhat bumpier again for markets in the next few months.

At the annual Jackson Hole Economic Symposium, Jerome Powell announced that the FOMC has adopted a flexible form of average inflation targeting as the key outcome of its monetary policy framework review. The policy change in our view raises inflation expectations going forwards and underpins the "lower for longer" dovish stance taken by the Fed.

Gross investment grade corporate issuance in the US over the June to August period reached \$440bn, 80% higher than the 10-year average. With investment grade corporate bond funds experiencing a record 21 straight weeks of inflows, there has been plenty of capital to digest the elevated supply.

Global credit markets can remain well supported by central bank intervention, particularly investment grade bonds. The ongoing demand for yield enhancement from global bond investors is becoming ever more key against a backdrop of somewhat less attractive valuations. Selection by sector and credit specific situation is particularly important.

We are cautious on holding long duration government bonds from a longer-term perspective, against current yield levels and continued elevated supply. There is the potential for near term periods of strength though, as long as central banks enhance QE buying sufficiently to offset supply and economic weakness is more protracted than currently anticipated by markets.

### Positioning

The Fund's bond exposure is currently split 17.7% in government bonds, 61.4% investment grade credit, and 20.9% high yield credit. The fund sold much of its long-held Centrica hybrid bond position in August. BP, Standard Chartered and Bankia were also among names that saw profit taking.

We have maintained our exposure to both Carnival and Royal Caribbean, both of which continue to perform very well. Our original thesis of the very supportive structure and long-term value governing these bonds remains intact.

Centrica announced a sale of its US assets and that it would use the proceeds for deleveraging, and the bonds benefited accordingly. With limited short-term catalysts to drive additional capital appreciation, we decided to take profit in the position.

The Fund's previous longer duration position in US Treasuries was essentially removed in early September, ahead of elevated supply concerns and a lack of demand through index extensions in August. We aim to actively manage the Treasury position to capitalise on supply/demand dynamics.

The Fund also still holds long positions in Italy, Spain and Portugal bonds and short futures positions in negative yielding Germany and France. These positions look to capitalise on the convergence of yields in Europe. The overall duration of the Fund was 2.0 at month-end.

The Fund maintained a 20% short Sterling-Dollar position into month-end, but this has subsequently transitioned to a short sterling-long Euro position. No deal Brexit concerns can remain heightened in the near term.

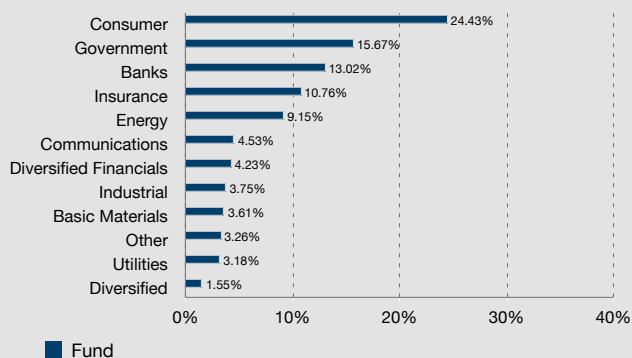
The portfolio's yield to maturity is currently 4.1%, compared to 2.5% at year-end, with the Fund's non-government bond exposure now offering a yield of 4.8%, as opposed to 3.7%. The income yield of 4.7% can act as a key foundation to expected Fund returns, whilst current spread levels can still provide capital gains from further credit spread narrowing.

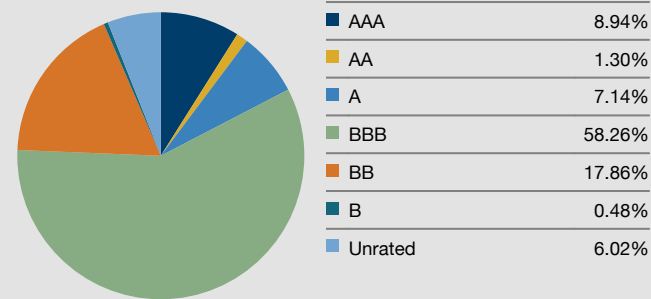
### CASH BOND EXPOSURE BREAKDOWN \$



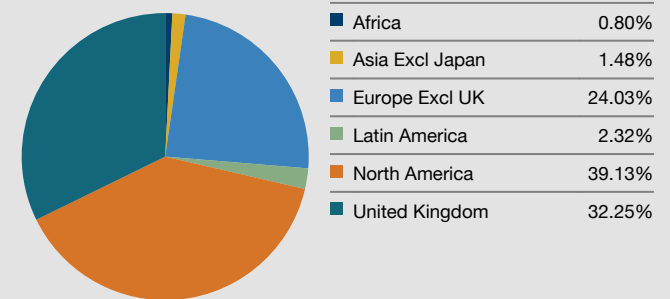

## GLOSSARY

<b>Annualised Return</b>	An annualised total return is an average amount of money earned by an investment each year over a given time period. It is calculated to show what an investor would earn over a period of time if the annual return was compounded.
<b>Annualised Volatility</b>	Volatility is the rate and extent at which the price of a portfolio, security or index, moves up and down. If the price swings up and down with large movements, it has high volatility. If the price moves more slowly and to a lesser extent, it has lower volatility. It is used as a measure of the riskiness of an investment. Annualised volatility is an average annual amount of volatility over a given time period.
<b>Credit Rating (quality)</b>	A score awarded by S&P, Moody's or Fitch to indicate the financial strength of the issuer of a bond, and the potential for a default on interest and principal payments. For example, according to the S&P rating scheme the top credit rating is 'AAA'. The lowest rating to be considered 'investment grade' is 'BBB-'. Below 'BBB-', bonds are termed 'sub investment grade' or 'high yield'. If more than one rating agency awards a score, the best rating will be chosen. If no official score is awarded by S&P, Moody's or Fitch a rating for the issuer will be used if available.
<b>Duration</b>	Expressed in years and measures the sensitivity of a bond's price to a change in interest rates. There is an inverse relationship between bond prices and interest rates.
<b>Entry Charge</b>	The entry charge shown is a maximum figure and in some cases you might pay less. Please refer to your financial advisor or the distributor for the actual charges.
<b>Exposure</b>	This refers to the part of a portfolio that is subject to the price movements of a specific security, sector, market or economic variable. It is typically expressed as a percentage of the total portfolio, e.g. the portfolio has 10% exposure to the mining sector.
<b>FX Forward</b>	An FX forward contract is an agreement to purchase or sell a set amount of a foreign currency at a specified price for settlement at a predetermined time in the future.
<b>Gross Exposure Rescaled</b>	If the portfolio has a gross exposure of 120% we may in some circumstances rescale this to equal 100% for sector or country breakdowns. For example, if United States Gross exposure is 40% of the 120% in the fund, the rescaled gross exposure would be $(40\%/120\%)*100\%$ which would be 30% so the United States makes up 30% of the total gross exposure when rescaled.
<b>Long Position</b>	A security that is bought in expectation that it will rise in value.
<b>NAV</b>	The Net Asset Value (NAV) represents the value per share. It is calculated by dividing the total net asset value of the fund (the value of the fund's assets less its liabilities) by the number of shares outstanding.
<b>Net and Gross Exposure</b>	The amount of a portfolio's exposure to the market. Net exposure is calculated by subtracting the amount of the portfolio with short market exposure from the amount of the portfolio that is long. For example, if a portfolio is 100% long and 20% short, its net exposure is 80%. Gross exposure is calculated by combining the absolute value of both long and short positions. For example, if a portfolio is 100% long and 20% short, its gross exposure is 120%.
<b>Ongoing Charge Figure (OCF)</b>	The OCF is based on expenses and may vary from year to year. It includes management fees but excludes performance fees (where applicable) and portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the Fund when buying or selling units in another sub-fund. The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.
<b>Performance Fee</b>	The payment made to an Investment Manager if certain performance levels are achieved (often over and above any levels set out in the investment objective) within a set time period. Please refer to the fund's prospectus for a complete description.
<b>Redemption Fee</b>	This is the maximum amount by which your investment may be reduced prior to the proceeds being paid out. Redemption fees are only applicable to Man GLG Flexible Bond D H USD Div and are payable on redemptions within 48 months of subscription. During the first 36 months the fee is calculated as 2.00% of NAV. From 37-48 months the fee is calculated as 1.00% of NAV.
<b>Running Yield</b>	At security level, running yield is the annual income on an investment divided by its current market value. At fund level, it is a weighted average of the contributing securities, based on absolute weights.
<b>Sector</b>	A sector is an area of the economy in which businesses share the same or a related product or service. It can also be thought of as an industry or market that shares common operating characteristics. Dividing an economy into different pieces allows for more in-depth analysis of the economy as a whole.
<b>Sharpe Ratio</b>	The Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return, and has become the industry standard for such calculations. The Sharpe Ratio is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk. The higher the ratio the better, with a number greater than 1 usually considered good, a number greater than 2 considered very good and a ratio of 3 or higher considered excellent. As it is an absolute measure of risk-adjusted return, negative Sharpe Ratios can be misleading and are therefore shown as N/A.
<b>Short Position</b>	Fund managers use this technique to borrow a security and then sell it with the intention of buying it back for less when the price falls. The position profits if the security falls in value. Within UCITS funds, derivatives – such as contracts for difference (CFDs) – can be used to simulate a short position.
<b>Synthetic Risk &amp; Reward Indicator (SRRI)</b>	Featured on the Key Investor Information Document (KIID), the SRRI is a measure of the overall risk and reward profile of a fund. Funds are categorised on a scale from 1 to 7 where 1 is the lowest risk and 7 is the highest. Typically, the SRRI is derived from the volatility of past returns over a 5-year period. Investors should be aware the indicator is based on historical data and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The lowest category does not mean risk free.
<b>Yield</b>	Yield to maturity (YTM) is the total return anticipated on a bond if the bond is held until the end of its lifetime. Yield to maturity is considered a long-term bond yield expressed as an annual rate, coupons are assumed to be reinvested at the same rate. This takes into account the change in yield should the issuer have the desire and the ability to retire the debt prior to maturity.
<b>YTD</b>	Year-to-date.

## RISK GLOSSARY

**Market Risk** - The Fund is subject to normal market fluctuations and the risks associated with investing in international securities markets. Therefore, the value of your investment and the income from it may rise as well as fall and you may not get back the amount originally invested.

**Counterparty Risk** - The Fund will be exposed to credit risk on counterparties with which it trades in relation to on-exchange traded instruments such as futures and options and where applicable, 'over-the-counter' ("OTC", "non-exchange") transactions. OTC instruments may also be less liquid and are not afforded the same protections that may apply to participants trading instruments on an organised exchange.

**Currency Risk** - The value of investments designated in another currency may rise and fall due to exchange rate fluctuations. Adverse movements in currency exchange rates may result in a decrease in return and a loss of capital. It may not be possible or practicable to successfully hedge against the currency risk exposure in all circumstances.

**Liquidity Risk** - The Fund may make investments or hold trading positions in markets that are volatile and which may become illiquid. Timely and cost efficient sale of trading positions can be impaired by decreased trading volume and/or increased price volatility.

**Financial Derivatives Instruments** - The Fund will invest financial derivative instruments ("FDI") (instruments whose prices are dependent on one or more underlying asset) to achieve its investment objective. The use of FDI involves additional risks such as high sensitivity to price movements of the asset on which it is based. The extensive use of FDI may significantly multiply the gains or losses.

**Leverage Risk** - The Fund's use of FDI may result in increased leverage which may lead to significant losses.

**Emerging Markets** - The Fund may invest a significant proportion of its assets in securities with exposure to emerging markets which involve additional risks relating to matters such as the illiquidity of securities and the potentially volatile nature of markets not typically associated with investing in other more established economies or markets.

**Non-Investment Grade Securities** - The Fund may invest a significant proportion of its assets in non-investment grade securities (such as "high yield" securities) are considered higher risk investments that may cause income and principal losses for the Fund. They are instruments which credit agencies have given a rating which indicates a higher risk of default. The market values for high yield bonds and other instruments tend to be volatile and they are less liquid than investment grade securities.
