





#### Performance review

The fourth quarter of 2023 supported the performance of the fund. Falling interest rates and lower credit spreads both contributed positively to the performance. Most of the gains came from spread duration while the pure duration effect was rather small (+5 bps in relative terms). Due to the short duration of the portfolio, gains from lower rates in longer maturity buckets were limited and the negative roll-down effect from the inverted yield curve also hurt. However, this was more than offset by the positive contribution coming from bonds with a slightly longer duration (3y-5y) than those included in the benchmark (1y-3y). Furthermore, relative performance was also boosted by the overweight held in bonds of financial institutions and the underweight in government bonds. We acknowledge risks coming from slower growth in major economies and keep a moderate risk profile in the portfolio.

### Market Review

Rapidly falling inflation across the globe led to a significant rally in the last seven weeks of the year. Markets started to price aggressive rate cuts by central banks into their forecasts for 2024, which led to higher valuations in pretty much all asset classes with the exception of energy/oil. 10y US Treasury yields dropped from 4.57% to 3.88% during the quarter while 10y Bunds fell 0.82% to 2.02%. Swiss bond yields were no exception and dropped 0.40% to 0.70% for 10y government bonds. The drop in inflation data was primarily due to falling energy prices which, in turn, were the result of slower growth in manufacturing and to a lesser extent in services. Consumers started to feel the impact of higher prices and more restrictive financial conditions. While central banks signaled to the market that interest rates were close to or at the peak level of this cycle, the US Fed was the exception and did already mention in December that cuts in the key rate would follow in 2024.
