Objectives and investment policy

- The aim is to provide income and moderate capital growth on your investment over time.
- The fund will invest in, or gain exposure to bonds (types of debt securities), equity securities (shares) money market instruments and cash instruments.
- The fund may invest directly into these asset classes or gain exposure to them by investing in other funds.
- The fund will normally invest at least 90% of its assets in (or gain exposure to) shares of companies or bonds (types of debt securities).
- The fund will invest in high and lower quality bonds and unrated bonds issued or guaranteed by governments, government agencies or companies.
- This debt is denominated in Euro, in other developed market currencies hedged into Euro or in emerging market currencies.
- The fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in (or gain exposure to) bonds and similar securities.
- The fund may invest up to 80% of its assets in (or gain exposure to) shares.
- The fund may gain exposure of up to 30% of its assets in other assets such as real estate, private equity, commodities and alternative investment strategies.
- The fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in Asset Backed Securities (ABS), including Mortgaged Back Securities (MBS). ABS and MBS are types of debt securities the repayments from which come from loans or mortgages.
- The fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in other open-ended funds, including other funds of HSBC. These other funds may use derivatives for investment purposes and/or hedging or efficient portfolio management purposes.
- The fund may invest no more than 10% of its assets in lower quality debt securities, issued or guaranteed by any single sovereign issuer.
- The fund will invest in developed and emerging markets
- The fund may invest in securities denominated in developed market or emerging market currencies. The fund's primary currency exposure will be to EUR. The fund will normally hedge non-EUR exposures into EUR
- The fund may use derivatives to meet its investment objectives.
- The fund may also use derivatives for hedging or efficient portfolio management purposes (such as to manage risks or costs or to generate additional capital or income).
- You may sell your investment on any working day by submitting an application to the Administrator before the dealing deadline.
- Income is distributed quarterly before fees are taken.
- Recommendation: this fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within a period of 5 years.

More about this rating

Why is this fund in category 5?

Diversification in Multi-Asset funds typically results in a lower risk profile than equity funds, but a higher risk profile than funds holding solely fixed income securities and/or money market instruments.

Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the SRRI

- **Exchange rate risk** Investing in assets denominated in a currency other than that of the investor's own currency perspective exposes the value of the investment to exchange rate fluctuations.
- Emerging market fixed income risk As interest rates rise debt securities will fall in value. Emerging economies typically exhibit higher levels of investment risk. Markets are not always well regulated or efficient and investments can be affected by reduced liquidity, a measure of how easily an investment can be converted to cash without a loss of capital, and a higher risk of debt securities failing to meet their repayment obligations, known as default. Higher yielding securities are more likely to default.
- Derivative risk The value of derivative contracts is dependent upon the performance of an underlying asset. A small movement in the value of the underlying can cause a large movement in the value of the derivative. Unlike exchange traded derivatives, over-the-counter (OTC) derivatives have credit risk associated with the counterparty or institution facilitating the trade.
- Asset backed securities (ABS) risk ABS are typically constructed from pools of assets (e.g. mortgages) that individually have an option for early settlement or extension, and have potential for default. Cash flow terms of the ABS may change and significantly impact both the value and liquidity of the contract.
- Alternative investments risk Alternative investments include private equity, commodities, hedge funds and property. They may be difficult to sell in a timely manner or at a reasonable price. It may be difficult to obtain reliable information about their value.
- **Operational risk** The main risks are related to systems and process failures. Investment processes are overseen by independent risk functions which are subject to independent audit and supervised by regulators.


