## Objectives and Investment Policy

Lazard European Alternative Fund (the "Fund") aims to seek long-term capital growth. The Fund will pursue its objective primarily by investing in a diversified portfolio of equities (i.e. shares) and equity-related securities of companies that are domiciled, incorporated or listed in Europe or which are not domiciled, incorporated or listed in Europe but which derive significant sources of profit from or have close economic links with Europe and in other financial instruments which provide exposure to such shares.

The Fund may invest up to 10% of its value in shares of companies that are domiciled, incorporated or listed in non-European countries which do not have close economic links with Europe.

Up to 20% of the Fund's value may be invested in emerging markets and the Fund may invest up to 5% of the Fund's value in securities listed or traded on the Regulated Markets of Russia.

The Fund may invest in cash and in investments that are deemed to be nearly equivalent to cash at any time and to the extent considered appropriate in light of market conditions. The Fund may also invest up to 10% of its value in units or shares of other investment funds (including exchange traded funds and other sub-funds of the UCITS).

The Fund may also invest in listed REITS (i.e. real estate investment trusts), exchange traded notes and closed-ended collective investment schemes where such investments are consistent with the Fund's Investment Policy.

The Fund may gain exposure to the asset classes above either by investing in them directly, or by using derivatives (which are financial contracts whose value is linked to the price of an underlying investment).

As a result of its use of derivatives, the Fund may be 'geared' or 'leveraged' (which can lead to a proportionately much larger movement in the value of the Fund's assets). The expected level of the Fund's leverage (as measured by the gross notional value of all derivatives positions) will be 250% of the value of the Fund.

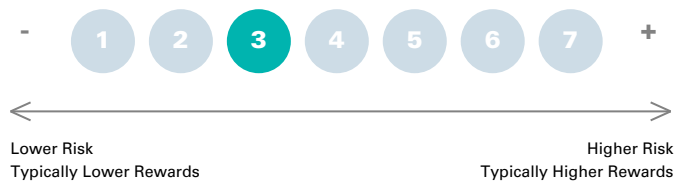
You can buy and sell your shares in the Fund on a day on which the stock exchanges in London and Dublin are open for business.

Income and profits, if any, attributable to your shares will not be paid out as a dividend, but will be accumulated in the Fund on your behalf and reflected in an increase in the value of your holdings.

The Fund has discretion as to which investments it will hold within the limits of the Investment Objective and Policy and stock selection is not undertaken by reference to a benchmark.

Recommendation: this Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within the short term.

## Risk and Reward Profile



The risk and reward categories above are calculated using historic data and may not be a reliable indicator of the Fund's future risk profile. The risk and reward category may shift over time and is not a target or guarantee. The lowest category (i.e. category 1) does not mean "risk free".

The risk rating of this share class is calculated on the basis of historic volatility – i.e. how much the value of the underlying assets of the Fund has fluctuated over the last 5 years. As this share class does not have 5 years' performance data available, we have simulated the volatility, using a suitable proxy, based on historic data.

This share class has been placed in the risk category stated above, because based on the simulated historic data, the underlying assets within the Fund have shown moderately low volatility.

Please note, there are other risks that may not be reflected in the risk and reward categories above. Some of these risks are summarised below.

- There is no capital guarantee or protection of the value of the Fund. The value of your investment and the income from it can go down as well as up and you may not get back the amount you invested.

- This Fund may invest in the securities of emerging markets. These markets may be less developed than others and so there is a risk that the Fund may experience greater volatility, delays in buying, selling and claiming ownership of these investments. Emerging markets may also have less developed political, economic and legal systems and there is a higher risk that the Fund may not get back its money.
  - There is a risk that the other side to certain contracts that the Fund may enter into may not be able to meet obligations. For example, this may arise in the Fund where an investment is made using a derivative (or a debt instrument), and the other side to the contract becomes insolvent, or is otherwise unable to meet its obligations. In such a case, the Fund may incur loss.
  - There are additional risks relating to the use of derivatives - the Fund invests in derivatives for the purposes of reducing exposure (hedging), gaining greater exposure, and speculating in the value of underlying investments. The use of derivatives to gain greater exposure to investments rather than by direct investment can increase the possibility for profit but also increase the risk of loss.
  - The Fund may invest in units or shares of other investment funds. Such other funds may themselves be subject to their own fees and expenses.
  - Your shares will be hedged with the aim of reducing the effect of exchange rate fluctuations between their denominated currency and the base currency of the Fund. This may not completely eliminate currency risk and therefore, any residual risk may affect the performance of your shares.

## Charges

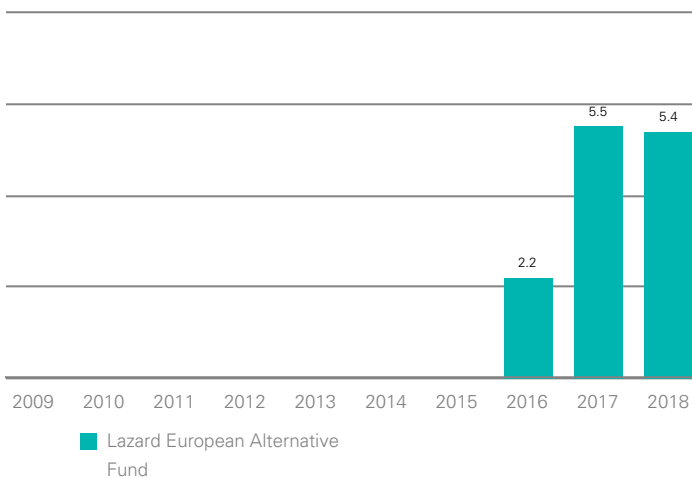
