
The fund's investment objective is to seek total return, measured in US dollars.

## Key Points:

- Primarily investment-grade U.S. dollar bond fund that integrates macro, bottom-up, and quantitative perspectives in an effort to add value through sector allocation, security selection, and duration/yield curve decisions
- This credit-biased portfolio has the flexibility to invest in all core investment-grade sectors as well as emerging markets and high-yield securities
- Through a collaborative process, portfolio managers set the strategy's risk budget and work with analysts to select securities



Other share classes will not share in these gains or losses.

3 Unlike other share classes, the Gross Income Share Class pays income before the expenses attributable to the share class have been deducted. This has the effect of increasing the amount of income paid and therefore the distribution rate will be higher than the Income Share Class. However, expenses will be deducted from the fund's capital gains and/or capital which may cause your principal value to be less than your original investment.
