Investment objective: To provide long-term capital growth by investing primarily in Singaporean companies.

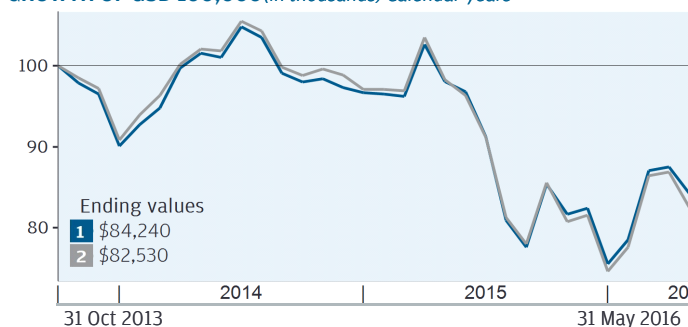

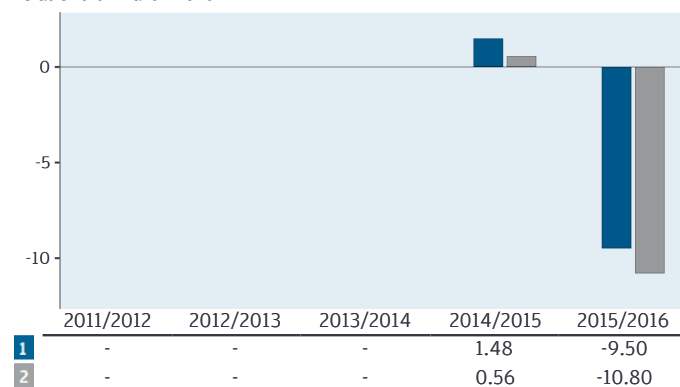

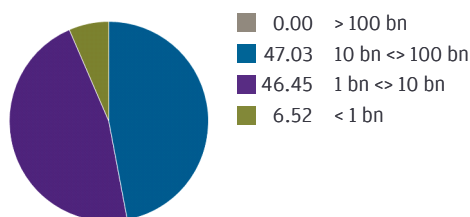

Key risks
