Objectives and investment policy

Objectives

The fund aims to provide an absolute return of 3 month LIBOR (or an equivalent reference rate) plus 1% (after fees have been deducted) over rolling 12-month periods by investing directly or indirectly in bonds issued by governments, government agencies and companies worldwide. Absolute returns means the Fund seeks a positive return over rolling 12-month periods in all market conditions, but this cannot be guaranteed and your capital is at risk

Investment Policy

The fund is actively managed and invests at least 80% of its assets directly, or indirectly through derivatives, in bonds denominated in sterling (or in other currencies and hedged back into sterling) issued by governments, government agencies, supra-national and corporate issuers worldwide. As the fund is index-unconstrained it is managed without reference to an index.

The fund may invest up to 50% of its assets in below investment grade securities as measured by Standard & Poor's or an equivalent credit rating agency, or in unrated securities.

The fund may invest up to 100% of its assets in asset-backed securities and mortgage-backed securities.

The fund may also invest directly or indirectly in securities (including in other asset classes), countries, regions, industries or currencies, collective investment schemes (including Schroder funds) and money market

The risk and reward indicator

Risk factors
