Objectives and investment policy

Objectives

The fund aims to provide capital growth and income in excess of the benchmark* (after fees have been deducted) over a 3 to 5 year period by investing in a diversified portfolio of bonds worldwide.

* The fund's benchmark is a composite of 50% of the iBoxx GBP Gilts Total Return and 50% of the iBoxx GBP Non-Gilts (Gross Total Return) index.

Investment policy

The fund is actively managed and invests at least 80% of its assets in bonds denominated in sterling (or in other currencies and hedged back into sterling) issued by governments, government agencies, supra-nationals and companies worldwide.

The fund may invest up to 10% of its assets in convertible bonds.

The fund may invest more than 20% of its assets in below investment grade securities (as measured by Standard & Poor's or any other equivalent credit rating agencies) or in unrated securities.
