Objectives and investment policy

Objectives

The fund aims to provide capital growth and income in excess of the ICE BofA Merrill Lynch Global Governments Inflation-Linked EUR Hedged Index after fees have been deducted over a three to five year period by investing in inflation-linked bonds.

Investment policy

The fund is actively managed and invests at least two-thirds of its assets in inflation-linked bonds with an investment grade or sub-investment grade credit rating (as measured by Standard & Poor's or any equivalent grade of other credit rating agencies for rated bonds and implied Schroders ratings for nonrated bonds) issued by governments, government agencies, supra-nationals and companies worldwide.

Inflation-linked bonds provide protection against the effects of rising prices as generally both the value of the original amount borrowed and the interest payments move in line with consumer prices.

The fund may also invest directly or indirectly in other securities (including other asset classes), countries, regions, industries or currencies, investment funds, warrants and money market investments, and hold cash.

The fund may use derivatives with the aim of achieving investment gains, reducing risk or managing the fund more efficiently.

Benchmark

The fund's performance should be assessed against its target benchmark being to exceed the ICE BofA Merrill Lynch Global Governments Inflation-

The risk and reward indicator

Risk factors

Capital risk / Distribution policy: As the fund intends to pay dividends regardless of its performance, a dividend may represent a return of part of the amount you invested

Capital risk / Negative yields: The fund may lose value when interest rates are very low or negative.

Credit risk: A decline in the financial health of an issuer could cause the value of its bonds to fall or become worthless.

Currency risk: The fund may lose value as a result of movements in foreign exchange rates.

This share class pays an annual distribution at a variable rate based on gross investment income.


