BEA Union Investment China A-Share Equity Fund

- BEA Union Investment China A-Share Equity Fund (the "Fund") invests in emerging markets may be subject to higher liquidity and volatility risks.
 The Fund will invest at least 70% of its net asset value in China A-Shares, primarily through a QFII which is subject to restrictions under QFII regulations and such change may take restrospective effect. These factors may adversely affect the liquidity and the value of the Fund. In addition to the use of the QFII quotas, direct exposure to certain eligible China A-Shares can be achieved via the Stock Connects, which is subject to quota limitations. Where a suspension in the trading through the Stock Connects is effected, the Fund's ability to achieve its investment objective could be negatively affected.
- The Fund's investments are concentrated in China and may be subject to high concentration risk and more volatility than that of funds having a more diverse portfolio of investment. The value of the Fund may be more susceptible to adverse economic, political, policy, foreign exchange, liquidity, tax, legal or regulatory event affecting the China market.

Any shortfall between the provision and actual tax liabilities will be debited from the Fund's assets, and the Fund's assets value will be adversely affected.
- In terms of currency hedged class units, adverse exchange rate fluctuations between the base currency of the Fund and the class currency
 of the currency hedged class units may result in a decrease in return and/or loss of capital for unitholders. Over-hedged or under-hedged

 will be successful in employing the hedge.
- The Fund may invest in the SME board and/or the ChiNext board of the Shenzhen Stock Exchange and/or the STAR board of the Shanghai Stock Exchange. - Maximum 30% in other securities, including China B-shares and China H-shares


