THE FUND

The Allspring Adjustable Rate Government Fund seeks current income by investing primarily in mortgage- and asset-backed securities issued or guaranteed by the U.S. government or government-sponsored enterprises (GSE).

FUND STRATEGY

- Seeks to outperform the 6-month Treasury Bill by investing in high-quality, adjustable-rate mortgage issues while typically maintaining a target duration of approximately 0.5 years.
- Typically holds most of its exposure in mortgage-backed securities, including collateralized mortgage obligations (CMOs) issued or guaranteed by U.S. government agencies or government-sponsored entities.
- Targets maintaining an average credit-quality rating that is equivalent to the highest rating available from a Nationally Recognized Statistical Rating Organization.

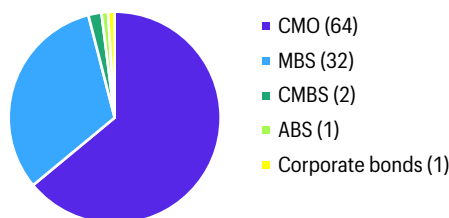

The manager has contractually committed through 12-31-2024, to waive fees and/or reimburse expenses to the extent necessary to cap the fund's total annual fund operating expenses after fee waivers at 0.74%(A), 1.49%(C), 0.60%(Admin) and 0.46%(I). Brokerage commissions, stamp duty fees, interest, taxes, acquired fund fees and expenses (if any), and extraordinary expenses are excluded from the expense cap. Prior to or after the commitment expiration date, the cap may be increased or the commitment to maintain the cap may be terminated only with the approval of the Board of Trustees. Without this cap, the fund's returns would have been lower. The expense ratio paid by an investor is the net expense ratio (the total annual fund operating expenses after fee waivers) as stated in the prospectus.
