What is this product?

Ordinary Shares in Murray International Trust PLC, an actively managed investment company registered in Scotland and listed on the premium segment of the London Stock Exchange. Shares of Murray International Trust PLC (the "Company") are bought and sold via markets. At any time, the price you would pay to acquire a share will normally be higher than the price at which you could sell it. The price may be at a premium or discount to the net asset value of the Company.

Term

The Company does not have a fixed life. abrdn Fund Managers Limited may not unilaterally terminate the Ordinary Shares however the Company may be wound up with shareholder approval.

Objectives

The Company's investment objective is to achieve an above average dividend yield, with long term growth in dividends and capital ahead of inflation, by investing principally in global equities. Within this objective, the Manager will seek to increase the Company's revenues in order to maintain an above average dividend yield. The Company's assets are invested in a diversified portfolio of international equities and fixed income securities spread across a range of industries and economies.

The Company has borrowed to purchase assets.

Intended Retail Investor

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 5 years.

This product has no required minimum holding period but is designed for medium to long-term investment. Since the value of investments and the income from them can rise and fall over differing time periods, you should have an investment horizon of at least 5 years when buying an investment of this type.
